*“Make a Difference”
Outreach to our Seniors*

As part of the Social Ministry & Outreach team, our parishioners were recently invited to make a difference in the lives of our elderly parishioners who reside in nursing homes and other senior facilities. As you may suspect we have many members of our parish family who are no longer able to sustain their own homes or whose medical condition does not permit them to live alone. We are blessed with a variety of quality facilities in our Rochester area, and our parishioners can be found in several of these locations.

You may also remember that the Holy Father in his visit to the United Kingdom in September made a visit to a residence for older people in Southwark, operated by the Little Sisters of the Poor. He used this visit as an opportunity to remind all of us of our responsibility for the aged and the appreciation that we need to express for their many gifts. “As advances in medicine and other factors lead to increased longevity, it is important to recognize the presence of growing numbers of older people as a blessing for society. Every generation can learn from the experience and wisdom of the generation that preceded it. Indeed the provision of care for the elderly should be considered not so much an act of generosity as the repayment of a debt of gratitude.”

The Pope went on to remind his listeners of the great example given to us all by the late John Paul II, who suffered very publicly during the last years of his life, but “his cheerfulness and forbearance as he faced his final days were a remarkable and moving example to all of us who have to carry the burden of advancing years.” The Holy Father encouraged in his address the elderly who have the opportunity to “remember in affectionate prayer all those whom we have cherished in this life, and to place all that we have personally been and done before the mercy and tenderness of God.”

Many thanks to all who participated in our “Make a Difference” Day. Thanks to Sr. Pat Pullman, S.S.J. and Sr. Joan Hilbert, R.S.M. of our Cathedral staff who devote much of their time to visiting our sick, shut-ins and elderly and the many parishioners who assist in bringing Holy Communion to our seniors.

Communal Celebration at all Masses Nov. 13 & 14

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is the sign of Christ’s healing presence in the world. Anyone, regardless of age, whose health is seriously impaired or threatened, may be anointed. The sacrament is not only for those in immediate danger of death, but for anyone whose illness is more than mild or passing, or whose physical or emotional health causes them serious worry or anxiety.

In this sacrament we call on the healing, restoring power of Jesus when we are at our lowest and most vulnerable. We gain strength to bear suffering with patience and dignity. We are reminded that, whatever we face, Jesus walks with us and with those we love.

SCRIPTURE STUDY FOR NEXT SUNDAY

Next Sunday, November 14th, is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings will be: Malachi 3:19-20; 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12; and Luke 21:5-19.

As we approach the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, the Church provides us with apocalyptic readings that refer to the end of time. These readings can seem somber or a bit frightening, but are also intended to convey the hope that is ours in Christ.

In our Old Testament reading, the prophet Malachi reminds those who seem to have forgotten their covenant with God that the unfaithful will end up like burned stubble while the faithful will feel the healing rays of the Lord's justice. The reading from the letter to the Thessalonians addresses those who are so busy waiting for the Lord to return that they have stopped working and spend their time minding the business of others.

The Gospel reminds us that 'those who persevere will secure their lives.' It lists a variety of challenging events that we will experience before the Lord comes; many that are very familiar to us: war, insurrection, earthquakes, famines, persecutions and divisions among loved ones. The Gospel says that these hardships will lead us to 'give our testimony.'

As we wait for Christ to come again, we give our testimony by living in hop, even as we experience upsetting and painful things. We express our faith in God's love by not giving up, by continuing to believe in the promise of our baptism, and by sharing that. *Rose Davis*
