



**PASTORAL PERSPECTIVES**

Several people have asked about my recent trip to Germany, Austria, Switzerland and the Czech Republic. It was a wonderful journey for many reasons. Fr. Michael Schramel, pastor of St. Jude's Parish, was the tour organizer who has visited Germany many times and put together an excellent itinerary. But also, quite outside Father Mike's control, was the group of 52 travelers that came together, including six priests, who greatly enjoyed each other's company. Besides the great beauty of the scenery – especially evident in the Bavarian Alps—two things stand out in my mind. First, the Passion Play at Oberammergau. This play dates back to a vow made in the year 1633. At the time, a terrible plague raged in the entire region, including Oberammergau. Many people died, and it was then the people of Oberammergau vowed to portray the "Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ" every ten years. From that moment on, not one person succumbed to the Black Death.

Between some of the scenes are displayed "Tableaux Vivants" or "Living Images" consisting of actors in motionless scenes, pointing to Old Testament events that are intended to serve as a meditation. At the same time, emotionally stirring music moves the performance, immersing the audience with the combined power of choir, orchestra and soloists.

The people of Oberammergau participate as actors and give an outstanding performance. The Play seeks to communicate the message of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus as an empowering event that speaks to the joys and hopes of every age. It was a powerful experience for all of us and I am sure for the many thousands of pilgrims that come from all over the world for this once-a-decade event. Plan on attending in 2020!

Another powerful experience happened to our group quite accidentally - it was not a part of the original tour. Some in the group requested that while we visited Munich (where we celebrated Mass at the beautiful Frauenkirche Ludwigstrasse Cathedral) we could visit Dachau, the site of one of the World War II concentration camps.

### SCRIPTURE STUDY FOR NEXT WEEK

Next Sunday is the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings will be: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29; Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24; and Luke 14:1, 7-14.

In next Sunday’s reading from Luke’s Gospel, Jesus is eating a meal in the house of a leading Pharisee. The “meals” which Jesus shares in the Gospel are always significant. They are opportunities for us to see Jesus in conversations with others and to hear his answers to questions and listen to his teachings. They are also glimpses of the eternal banquet which we are invited to share in the Kingdom of God. The truths which Jesus reveals at his earthly meals are glimpses of the Kingdom.

Next Sunday the Old and New Testament readings teach the importance of the quality of humility. The author of the book of Sirach, a wise man from Jerusalem, wrote “humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God.”

Jesus teaches about the meaning and practice of humility by telling a parable. The humble wedding guest seats himself in the lowest place—by nature he merits no other place. The host chooses to acknowledge the friendship with this guest and to move the guest to a place of high honor. Humility is not putting oneself down, it is simply an awareness and acceptance of who we humans really are—limited and sometimes sinful beings who are graciously invited into a loving relationship with God the perfect being.

The humble person is always mindful that every other person is equally valuable and dignified in God’s eyes. It is God’s love alone that has raised each of us out of simple creaturehood—to the status of beloved children.
