PASTORAL PERSPECTIVES

Stewardship Fair Coming!!

Stewardship is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus; where it has been implemented, both givers' and receivers' lives have been changed. Stewardship is a way of life, a way of thanking God for all our blessings by returning a portion of the time, talent and treasure allotted to us. Stewardship engenders a spirituality that deepens our relationship with the Lord. Stewardship involves intentional, planned and proportionate giving of our time, talent and treasure. Stewardship addresses both individual parishioners as well as parishes themselves.

Giving of time involves being with God in prayer and worship, sharing our love with family and friends, and volunteering our time and community activities that help others and promote justice. Sharing our talent arises from the fact that God has given each of us the ability and gifts to do certain things well and we are to develop those talents for the good of others.

Stewardship is an integral part of our spiritual life and we give in that context because we are grateful to God for what God has already given us. We give freely because we want to, not because we have to.

On the weekend of **October 31 – November 1**, our own Cathedral Stewardship Committee, grown and revitalized as a result of our strategic **Plan Forward**, will conduct our second annual Stewardship Fair. Last year, several parishioners came forward to enlist in various committees and organizations that serve our parish family. SCRIPTURE STUDY FOR NEXT SUNDAY

Next Sunday, October 31, is the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings will be: Wisdom 11:22-12:2; Thessalonians 1:11-2:2; and Luke 19:1-10.

The Book of Wisdom, which provides our first reading, was written 50 to 100 years before the birth of Jesus by a member of the Jewish community at Alexandria, Egypt. Through this writer, we are reminded that God loves everything that God has made. Even though the whole universe is no more than a grain of wheat or a drop of dew compared to God, God loves it all – loathing nothing that He has made.

The Gospel reading from Luke is the story of the short, chief tax collector, Zacchaeus, who climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus. The crowds around Jesus considered tax collectors to be less than honorable and couldn't understand why Jesus would tell Zacchaeus "come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." After visiting with Zacchaeus, Jesus said to him "today salvation has come to this house...the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Our reading from Wisdom reminds us of God's great love for all He has created, including us; we exist because of God's continuing love for us, even when we turn away through sin. God sent Jesus to seek us out and to save us. And we are to be open like Zacchaeus, eager to "see" Jesus and to welcome his saving presence into our complicated and sometimes sinful lives.

General Sacrament Meeting
For Parents - TODAY!

The sacraments are visible signs of God's loving presence in our lives, which are meant to be celebrated in community. I receive several calls a week from parents who are interested in First Communion classes for their children. I ask them if their child attends a Catholic School or if he/she is receiving formal religious education lessons. Before any child is prepared to celebrate sacraments, he/she should have been in a religious instruction program for **at least** one full year prior to preparation for sacraments. This stance is held by all churches throughout our diocese. Religious education does not end following sacraments. It is an ongoing process throughout a lifetime. We offer religious education classes for children through middle school and then an on going youth program for high schoolers. It is not too late to register your child for religious education!

If you would like to learn more about our sacramental preparation program for children, you are invited to attend our General Sacrament session for parents today, Sunday, October 24th from 11:00 until 12 noon in the Rectory Hall. Attendance at this meeting is required for families who anticipate their child celebrating sacraments during the 2010/2011 school year.
