



PASTORAL PERSPECTIVES

The gospels contain many examples of stewardship. For example, in 2 Corinthians St. Paul writes: "Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work ... enriched in every way for all generosity, which through us produces thanksgiving to God." As Bishop Clark once commented on this sharing: "When we have done this well – taken our gifts, improved them and shared them, when we have made others' lives a little better or built something that adds to the richness of life, don't we look at this accomplishment with pure joy?"

We are extremely blessed with many individuals and families who generously share their time, talent and treasure with us at the Cathedral Community. Several new outreach ministries have developed due to such wonderful generosity. But we continue to need more parishioners to assist in the variety of opportunities that are present in our community for service, still unfolding, and even yet to be. Our recently reinvigorated Stewardship Committee, continuing to develop the Cathedral "Plan Forward" (Strategic Plan) is working on a variety of initiatives that can help us become more involved in our faith community. Once such opportunity is a "Ministry Fair" which will be conducted after each of one of this weekend liturgies, October 30 – 31. This weekend will feature many displays sponsored by our parish committees and organizations that will describe their mission. The Stewardship Committee has promised to make the Narthex a "place of destination" and an exciting venue for the Fair!

Each parishioner this weekend will have the opportunity to learn more about our ministries and hopefully come forward to join in the mission of service to our Community.

SCRIPTURE STUDY FOR NEXT SUNDAY

Next Sunday, November 7, is the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings will be: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14; 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5; and Luke 20:27-38.

Our readings next Sunday speak to our Catholic belief in the resurrection of the dead. This is a particularly timely topic during the month of November when we pray in a special way for the Holy Souls, our departed loved ones.

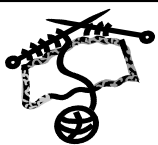
In Jesus' day, not all Jews believed in life after death. For example, the Pharisees believed in eternal life while the Sadducees did not. In our reading they debated with Jesus and put forth an elaborate dilemma of a woman married, and in turn widowed, to seven brothers. "Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be?" they asked.

Jesus' response does not engage the specific question, but answers them by affirming two truths of our faith:

1. God is the God of the living - those of us alive on this earth now, and those who have died to this life (including Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob) and now live in a way we can only imagine.
2. Death does not end life but transforms life in such a way that we don't need to worry about how earthly categories might apply in the next life.

We need only to trust that God, who is love, will hold our deceased loved ones (and us when it's our turn) "in love," and will honor and protect the loving relationships we were privileged to begin here on earth.

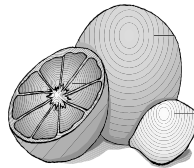
